**Philippians 3:4-6 -** <sup>4</sup>though I myself have reasons for such confidence. <sup>5</sup>If anyone else thinks he has reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; <sup>6</sup>as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for legalistic righteousness, faultless.

Persecuted Christians.

Pharisee.

Prefect in the keeping of the Law.

People would recognize him as a true Israelite.
